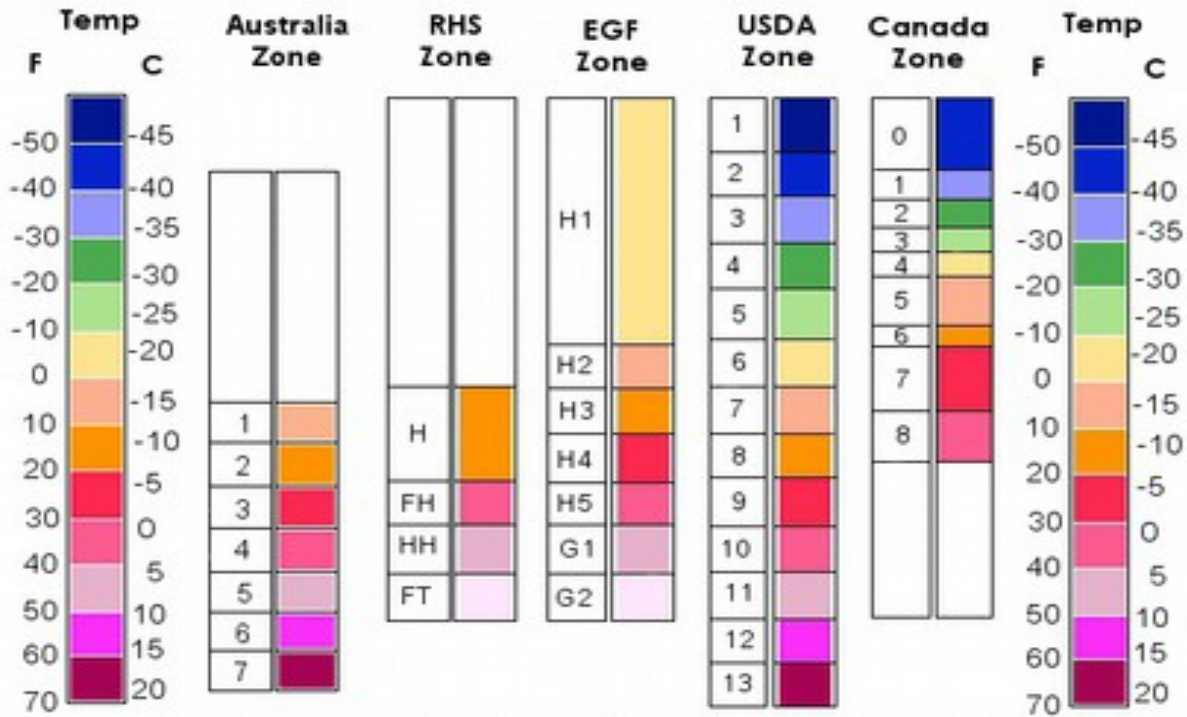


Plant Hardiness Zones Worldwide

This page shows the relationship between the USDA, RHS (UK), EGF (European), and Canadian hardiness zones. When you are browsing information from other countries, this reference will help you to determine whether a plant native to another area might survive in yours.



Soil requirements, number of sunny days and number of days over 86F/30C will determine if a plant can survive in a similar hardiness zone.

Investigate your plant's requirements before buying live plants or seed.
